ANUGRAHA SCHEME


It is a social security initiative by the Government of Karnataka designed to provide financial relief to farmers and shepherds in the event of the accidental death of their livestock.





After being temporarily suspended, the scheme was revived in 2023.

KEY BENEFITS & COMPENSATION (BUDGET 2025-26)


As per the recent Karnataka State Budget 2025-26, the compensation amounts have been enhanced to better support rural livelihoods:


 **Cattle (Cows, Buffaloes, Bullocks):**
Increased from ₹10,000 to ₹15,000. ↑

 **Sheep & Goats (Adult):**
Increased from ₹5,000 to ₹7,500. ↑


 **Lambs & Kids (Aged 3-6 months):**
Increased from ₹3,500 to ₹5,000. ↑


ELIGIBILITY & REQUIREMENTS


✓ **Eligible Beneficiaries:**
Farmers and shepherds residing in Karnataka. 

✓ **Verification:**
An autopsy must be conducted by a veterinarian. 

✓ **Documentation:**
• Post-mortem report. 

• GPRS-tagged photographs of the deceased animal (taken before and after the autopsy). 

• Aadhaar-linked bank account details for Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT). 

• Self-attested application form and vouchers. 

IMPLEMENTATION



The scheme is managed by the Department of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services and the Karnataka Sheep and Wool Development Corporation.
